It's all happening in the park

Hello members,

Things are really exciting at the parklands as we prepare for the new financial year.

We have secured a grant of \$45,000 from the Federal Government to install bio-bale cartridges into the leachate system at long last. This is a new technology (partially developed by the Darebin Parklands), where minerals and bacteria are used to clean up the leachate. This will make the water in the pond network clear and cleaner and make a huge difference to the appearance of the wetlands on the Alphington side of the park.

Other projects include:

- Darebin Council is funding the production of 10,000 high quality visitor brochures/maps and also new signs for the entrances and throughout the park
- Melbourne Water is preparing to undertake significant works along the creek throughout the park, with the focus on the creek near the railway bridge
- Banyule Council is investigating the funding of a new management plan for the park in partnership with Darebin Council
- RMIT is funding the revegetation of the Horseshoe Mound while its students undertake studies on the cultural and recreational uses in the park, as well as preparing management plan briefs
- And of course Westpac has agreed to fund stage two of the Hidden Valley path project.

Several other projects are close to being decided as well, so all in all things are very good at Darebin Parklands.

Over the next two months the rangers will be undertaking more small mosaic burns throughout the park. These cool burns produce lots of smoke, so don't be too concerned if you see smoke.

We have prepared several areas for future DPA Park Care Days. The main areas we are keen for the DPA to plant out and develop are the Island below Wynstay Crescent, along the creek, which has the magnificent sandstone backdrop, and the Yarana Road/Parklands Avenue corner and fence line, which is highly visible and needs some TLC.

And finally, just a note that SBS will be filming a documentary on the business entrepreneur Fletcher Jones in park in the coming weeks.

News in brief

Darebin-Yarra trail The DPA is part of a coalition of community groups that regularly meets with Parks Victoria to support the planning for the Darebin-Yarra trail. Parks Victoria recently received planning approval to build the next section that will extend the current path from the railway bridge for another 100 metres and across the creek. Unfortunately that still won't get it under Heidelberg Rd – that's next year's project. We'll keep you posted on further developments.

Westpac Hidden Valley project The DPA recently received confirmation that the next stage of the Westpac Bank-Landcare project has been approved. The next stage will see further revegetation of Hidden Valley, on the Ivanhoe side of the creek near the big palm tree. The project provides funding for materials and on-ground input by Westpac Bank staff. The DPA is pleased to build on our relationship with the Westpac Bank and we look forward to seeing further great work happen in this beautiful part of the park.

Banyule Council funding A deputation of DPA committee members and head ranger Peter Wiltshire recently met with Banyule Council's Cr Jenny Mulholland to discuss the council's funding of the Darebin Creek Management Committee. The DPA is concerned about the level of funding by the council to the committee for upkeep of the parklands. Cr Mulholland expressed her support for funding for development of a management plan for the park. Darebin Council has already allocated money for this vital project and the DPA is very pleased that Banyule Council will now consider its contribution as part of its forthcoming budget process.
